We are extremely honored to partner with The Jewish Museum in New York City to bring GIANT creative STEM experiences to the museum's community. To celebrate Hanukkah, we highlighted the "Light Through the Darkness" by constructing bold and vivid lightboxes, adorning celebratory figurines in jewels and expressive finery and creating a community mural that was quite literally an explosion of joy in the form of drawings, confetti, and a rainbow of paper strips.
